

NYC Project Map



- 1 LIBRARY WALK** - 41st Street between Park Avenue and Fifth Avenue. Take 4,5,6,7,S trains to Grand Central Station at 42nd St. Ninety-six permanently installed bronze panels about books and literature.
- 2 HERALD SQUARE GATES** - 34th Street and Broadway. Take N, R, W, Q trains to 34th Street Station. Cast bronze owls on the gate posts to the square, based upon the masthead of the New York Herald.
- 3 GREELEY SQUARE GATES** - 32nd St. and Broadway. Take N, R, W, Q trains to 34th St., walk two blocks south on Broadway. Cast bronze eagles on the gate posts to the square, based upon the masthead of the NY Tribune.
- 4 ARCHITECTS' BUILDING TRIBUTE** - Park Ave. between 40th St. and 41st St. Take 4,5,6,7, S train to Grand Central Station, walk one block south, on the east side of Park Ave. Twenty architectural portraits set in the sidewalks.
- 5 EXCHANGE PLACE MAP** - Between Grand and Essex Streets in Jersey City. Take Path train to Exchange Place. A "surreal" map set in the platform of the Exchange Place light rail station.
- 6 TRACKS** - 45th Street and Bayonne Station Stop on Hudson Bergen Light Rail System. Take Path train to first stop in NJ, Exchange Place, and board Hudson Bergen Light Rail. Colored concrete floor design in platform.
- 7 FOLEY SQUARE** - Fork where Lafayette St. meets Center St. Take 6 train to City Hall, walk uptown 2 blocks. Imbedded medallions at the ends of five pathways radiating from central fountain portray the history of Foley Square.
- 8 UNION SQUARE TIMELINE** - Broadway and 14th Street. Take N, R, Q, W, 4, 5, 6 trains to Union Square. Twenty different bronze panels depicting various historical events in Union Square set at the Square's southern end.
- 9 UNION SQUARE LABOR HISTORY** - Set on the west side of the Park, between the timeline mentioned above and the Gandhi sculpture is another smaller timeline which traces the history of garment workers in New York.
- 10 FLUSHING BAY PROMENADE / GRANITE ANIMAL & PLANT ALPHABET** - Flushing Bay, Queens, stretching 1.4 mi., from the base of the 27th Ave. overpass to the boat ramp. Carved black granite panels set in railing posts.
